

Press Release of the 2022 Salzburg Festival

Kirill Petrenko conducts the Berlin Philharmonic in the first of two concert programmes. Daniel Harding takes over the second concert.

(SF, 24 August 2022) Due to a serious foot injury which subsequently required an operation, **Kirill Petrenko** has been advised by his doctors to reduce his workload. The chief conductor of the Berlin Philharmonic will conduct Gustav Mahler's Symphony No. 7 as planned on Sunday, 28 August.

Daniel Harding has kindly agreed to conduct the Berlin Philharmonic on the following evening, in a programme that has been modified. As announced, Tabea Zimmermann will perform as the soloist in Alfred Schnittke's Concerto for Viola and Orchestra. Daniel Harding has chosen the Symphony No. 4 in E-flat-major by Anton Bruckner for the second half of the concert.
